



## Reflections from Daphne Romania 2010

I was blessed to be able to serve children and staff at Grace Christian School by assisting with ESL and “other duties as assigned”. I also visited a one room school house in a small village where I taught English and American History and Culture. While educating young women and young men in the placement centers on the sanctity of human life (SOHL), I was able to show them how precious they are to our Father in Heaven by using the Word to show them His love, and will and purpose for their lives (i.e. Psalm 139:13-18, Jeremiah 29:11, Romans 8:28... and through the lives of Joseph, Moses, Esther and others, but particularly our Savior, Jesus the Christ).

I also had the opportunity to speak in numerous churches and with several different women’s groups regarding acts of love and service as well as SOHL—specifically abortion and post-abortion healing and had the opportunity to bring awareness to these issues and the church’s responsibility and appropriate response. Church youth groups and residents of placement centers were engaged in discussions regarding the benefits of sexual integrity/purity and abstinence and made aware of the consequences of poor choices with respect to sexual activity (i.e. STDs, unplanned pregnancy, abortion...).

Encouragement to pray and seek God’s will in all things and to make wise godly choices was shared. Brothers and sisters were reminded of the Resurrection Power within every believer, their duty to fulfill the Great Commission and challenged to “live out their faith”.

I’ve been to Romania each of the past four years, but in this my fifth year I was there for a little over five weeks and I saw and experienced God moving everyday... everywhere. I traveled all over the Romanian countryside and spoke with and to hundreds of people in a variety of locations and places. I have dozens of stories and testimonies to share and took nearly 2000 photographs.

I am so blessed to be able to walk in my calling. God is so awesome and I can barely contain myself as I am compelled to say, "Here am I; send me".
